## STUDENT ELIGIBILITY + SKILLS/ATTRIBUTES

- For <u>Plumbing and Cooking</u>, current grades 10-11 may apply (for these, applications received past our deadlines MAY be considered if space remains)
- For all other Train in Trades programs, students applying take these during their grade 12 year (apply in Gr 11)
- Keen interest in field for which student is applying
- Current/prior ADST course work (e.g. Tech Ed, Foods)
- Comfortable using tools/power equipment of chosen area
- Readiness/maturity for participation in a post-secondary environment
- In good physical shape (stamina/strength)
- Strong English language skills to communicate and interpret technical program terminology
- Strong Math and Science skills for solving problems and making decisions
- Driver's license an asset (certain industry work sites expect their employees to be able to drive)

## **Understanding PROGRAM COSTS for Youth Train in Trades Programs**

By taking a *YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES* program while in high school, SD38 students will <u>save the cost of tuition</u> (a savings between \$2500 - \$5000). This cost is <u>covered by the Richmond School District #38</u>.

- Post-Secondary fees may include a variety of college, student union and compass pass fees.


## After Application is Submitted...

- If successful with the above, notification of <u>conditional</u> acceptance will be sent to applicant in May/June.
- The Career Programs Office will arrange for a program site visit with student.
- Marks, attendance and behaviour will be reviewed to determine if final acceptance can be offered (late June for programs starting Summer/September and late November for programs starting in January/February).
