Understanding PROGRAM COSTS for Youth Train in Trades Programs

NOTE: All fees are approximate at time of printing and are subject to change.

By taking a YOUTH TRAIN IN TRADES program while in high school, SD38 students will <u>save the cost of tuition</u> (a savings between \$2500 - \$4700). This cost is <u>covered</u> by the Richmond School District #38.

- Post-Secondary fees may include a variety of college, student union and compass pass fees.
