
- Ancillary fees may include a variety of college, student union and compass pass fees.

- Marks, attendance and behaviour will be reviewed to determine if final acceptance can be offered (late June for programs starting August/September and late November for programs starting in January/February).


Acceptance is subject to approval. As <u>program seats are limited</u>, completion of application and granting of an interview do NOT guarantee acceptance into the program.
